Stop and Help, or, Keep Going

Let me start with a true story. Two people were walking down the street and came across a guy who was asking for help – begging for money. He was just sitting there with his hand out asking "Can you give me some money?" ... Let me stop there for a moment.

I am not sure if you have ever experienced this, but I am sure you can imagine it. Two people were walking to place they needed to get to. As they walked, they were confronted with a man who was in need. In fact, he was not only sitting there as they walked by, he also calling out "HELP ME!". I cannot speak for the two people, but I am sure that I could have just kept on going. I could have easily said, "I am sorry, I don't have anything to help you with". Perhaps, I could have kept on going and even looked the other way, ignoring the person who needed help. Indeed, regardless of what they did, they might have even thought, "Why don't you just get a job?". These seem like normal and actual responses that others may have when they come across a beggar. Perhaps they may even be your responses too.

For the record, the two people in story did not have any money to share. They could have walked by and said "We don't have any money to share" and kept walking. They would have been right and okay in doing that. But that was not what they did.

Now, it just so happens that because they did not have money and they did say this very thing "We do not have any money". But, that was not where the story ended. No, these two people were followers of Jesus. They loved Jesus and had also learned to love others too. Instead of saying "we have no money" and kept going, they said "we have no money, BUT, what we do have we give to you". Then the person talking to the beggar said, "I tell you, by Jesus' name,

get up and walk". See, the beggar did have a disability. He could not walk. So, this believer (and his friend), gave the man something that he could not imagine, the ability to walk. What a miracle this must have been.

If you would like to see more details about this story, grab your Bibles and look at Acts chapters 3 and 4. If you look, you will see that the two people are Peter and John and the person begging is a man who was crippled and over 40 years old. What an event to have happen at the very beginning of the growth of the New Testament Church. Now, let me tell you why I share this story. I was thinking about the story and realized that I may have never said anything to the person begging. I may have just kept going and not even looked at the person, ignoring them. Perhaps, I may have even saw him, looked at him, but said "I am sorry I cannot help you". Maybe you may have done the same. But what this event tells me is that even in that moment, that chance that I get to serve someone, I can interact with someone and bring Jesus' love and care. I might not be able to ask God for the miracle to walk, but I can ask God to bless the person I am talking with. I can ask God to use that time to bless them, as well as to bless me with a more sensitive heart for others.


See, for Peter and John, they could have walked by, but they didn't. And the result of the event was not just that the man was healed. No. The result was not only a conversation and healing, but it also led to interaction with the religious leaders there. It also led to other people seeing this healing. Finally, it also led to a strengthening of the rest of the followers of Jesus there. All this, because Peter and John were willing to stop and talk with a person in need.
